



Tasmania's economy is Back on Track and the 2016-17 Budget reinvests in essential services like health, education and supporting vulnerable Tasmanians.

For Lyons this means investing in schools and hospitals and supporting projects which create jobs and improve lives. Projects for the next four years include:

STATEWIDE INITIATIVES

After two years of a Hodgman Liberal Government the Budget and Tasmania are Back on Track.

JOBS AND THE ECONOMY
