Vietnam Veterans Vigils in Tasmania

Sixty years ago the Australian Army Training Team arrived in South Vietnam on 3 August 1962 and 2023 marks 50 years since the withdrawal of combat troops in 1972.

Minister for Veterans' Affairs, Guy Barnett said it was important to mark these important occasions and pay tribute to those who have served Australia.

"The Vietnam Veteran Vigils being held in Tasmania are an opportunity for Tasmanians to pause and remember the service and sacrifice of Vietnam Veterans 50 years on from the cessation of the Vietnam War," Minister Barnett said.
